Welcome to the Regions Rising National Summit for 2024, the Regional Australia Institute's (RAI) annual flagship event.

The theme for this year's Summit is The New Frontier and I truly believe this phrase encapsulates regional Australia at this moment in time.

The regions stand on the precipice of enormous change. Nearly 10 million people now call our regions home, and research shows us the nation's love affair with regional living is far from over. A new era is upon us – a time when the lifestyle, career opportunities and affordability of our regions are proving magnetic, drawing in and retaining people in our regional communities. This report, delivered through our Intergovernmental Shared Inquiry Program, a collaborative partnership with Federal and State Governments, shines a light on the community dynamics, barriers and enabling factors in regional Australia's transition journey. It provides an evidence driven base, which can be used to shape decision making in the years come.

Over the coming days together, we will begin to plan for what will be needed in our new regional frontier: a place where we see equality, prosperity, beauty and belonging. It's exciting and daunting and I look forward to embarking on this journey with you.
